(Here you describe how this place looks, smells, feels, and sounds. Always think of phrases that create a mental image. For example: Instead of writing the ant's burrow was small, you might say the ant's burrow was no bigger than my thumb. Instead of saying the pond wasn't clean, you might say the pond was as dirty as a pig's mud puddle. Here you want to write how the character looks and feels.)

2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph- describes the problem that the character faces.

3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph- describes the solution and explains the myth.

Don't forget to use the repeated words or phrases throughout the story.
